**Vera Mae Williams** (Lifetime member of the Omeme & District Horticultural Society) passed away peacefully on November 13th, 2011. Vera was in her 97th year. Vera was an active member within our society and served on the Board of Directors as well the Executive. Even in her late eighties, Vera continued to attend meetings in her position as Honorary Director. She actively served on phone committees right up to the year she sold her Omeme home and moved into a Peterborough Residence at the age of 90. For many years Vera served on the Nominating committee and as a result, she was instrumental in "**convincing**" many of today's executive members and Directors that they would "**really enjoy**" filling some of the vacant positions. While in her new home in Peterborough, she continued to pass on her love of gardening and kept up with what was happening in her home garden society. In 2007 Vera was awarded the honour of being the first winner of our new OHA 100th Anniversary trophy for Outstanding Contribution in the Field of Horticulture. Vera will be long remembered for her part in making our society what it is today.
