Village Gardens and Planters

Each fall, we have a general clean up of the gardens and planters. Following that, we have a great time decorating the village planters with winter greens. We spend one afternoon collecting evergreen boughs as well as dried plant accents i.e. sumac, galls, teasels, hydrangeas. A few days later, we do the decorating. Last year we had many helpers, so it went quickly and was great fun. You don't have to be experienced ...you will earn quickly! So plan to come out and enjoy the fall fun. It is a great way to end the gardening season! Dates: the goal is to clean out the planters the last week in October and to decorate them with greenery the first week in November. Dates for these events will be sent out by email & phone as soon as we have a break in the rainy weather.

Plan to join us for these afternoons. Bring snips, loppers, and gloves. Make sure your name is on them in case they get mixed up. On the day we gather greens- tarps are useful and when decorating the planters- a broom, watering can, wagon, or wheel barrel is also helpful. Don't miss out on the fun!

Those attending included members of the soldiers' immediate families as well as fellow officers and families of other fallen soldiers from the surrounding area. There were also representatives from surrounding Royal Canadian Legions, and the many service groups from the village. Guests were welcomed by President Heather Grassie on behalf of the Horticultural Society and President Jim Fairfield on behalf of the Legion members, Branch 497. Greetings were also received from the Mayor and Councillors from the City of Kawartha Lakes. Following a short service inside, conducted by Rev. Paul Grassie, the guests moved out to the garden for the dedication of the Memorial. Following the service, guests were invited back inside for a fellowship time of refreshments. Aron Muscutt showed his video presentation of the "making of the garden" and the families, the Legion and the Historical Society were presented with copies of the DVD.

Hazel was responsible for drafting our Constitution, recording our early history and in producing our first history book, as well as our first year book. She was an avid photographer and her photos record the happenings in the Omeme Society from the early days right up to the time her health failed. She represented our society at District 4 events for many years and went on to hold many offices of responsibility, including that of District Director. She received many awards for her work. Hazel was also a member of both the Peterborough and Lakefield Societies. She began the Peterborough Master Gardeners program and she was an accredited judge.

She will be long remembered by her friends and fellow gardeners.
