What is a Floriade?

Floriade is an international exhibition of flowers and gardening held every 10 years in the Netherlands. It is being held for the 6th time in 2012 in Venlo, the Netherlands from April 5 to October 7. The theme this year is "Be part of the theatre in nature, get closer to the quality of life". This Floriade includes 100 acres (66 hectares of park), 40 hectares of show grounds, including approximately 100 exhibitors, 100,000 flowers for your viewing pleasure, 30 country exhibitions, wine tastings, the biggest cable car ride in the Netherlands with a capacity 4000 people per hour, cultural shows as well as regional culinary delights and 5 restaurants. Past floriades have taken place as follows: 1960 Rotterdam, 1972 Amsterdam, 1982 Amsterdam, 1992 Zoetermeer and 2002 Haarlemmermer. Wouldn't it be wonderful to visit a Floriade but even if you can't, check out http:// www.floriade.com/floriade-2012 to see what it is all about

If, per chance, you find yourself in Europe this summer, you might like to include the Floriade in your trip or there are tours available through your travel agent including a river cruise down the Rhine in May and another in September, this one is guided by Denis Flanagan of Landscape Ontario which both include a visit to the Floriade in Venlo.
