Snacks! Snacks! Snacks!



The Junior Garden Club of Omemee

The year 2016 marks the 70th anniversary of the Omemee Junior Garden Club. There will be a small celebration to remember this milestone year. (1946-2016)

The Garden Club usually meets 3 times a year.

The first meeting will be held on Saturday, June 4, 2016, the time and location are to be confirmed. At this first meeting the Juniors receive seeds to plant, seedlings to transplant and do some nature related craft activities.

The Juniors (along with their parent's guidance and support) plant and tend their gardens throughout the summer growing season. They harvest their vegetables and gather some flowers from their hard work and bring them in to display them at the August 15, 2016 Show.

The third meeting is usually a craft activity centred event held in October.

Our Junior Gardeners are divided into 4 classes. **Sprouts** are Pre-K, JK and SK children. Next comes the Grade 1's and 2's called the **Sprouts**, followed by the Grade 3's and 4's who answer to the **Buds**. Lastly are the Grade 5's and up and they are called the **Bloomers**. Each group has different tasks to accomplish according to their age and ability.

<u>Our Aim and Goal:</u> "To give the children of the Junior Garden Club the opportunity to learn, to enjoy, and to appreciate the skills of gardening for life through hands-on-experiences."
