These are some common Geographical Features in our area. Come to our next meeting and learn about some of these interesting land features!

Don Collins is a retired teacher from the Peterborough & Pineridge Board of Education where he taught Chemistry and Biology. Living in this beautiful area, Don developed a side interest in the geographical features created by the long ago glaciers in the Peterborough and Kawartha Lakes area. We are surrounded by some amazing features and drive past them daily i.e. drumlins, eskers, lake beds, spillways, and of course those living in the Bobcaygeon area are very familiar with their rocky ground base, while some of us have sand or clay soil. 
