The weather just isn't playing in our favour is it! We are all VERY ready for SPRING! Hopefully it will all happen soon!

It is hard to believe that our plant sale is just a little over a month from now (before our next meeting in May!) So, even though the weather isn't co-operating, we can still start planning now.

We will need plants! Lots and lots of plants!

- 1. Make a list of all the plants in your garden that you remember being ready to be divided. When the weather changes, you will be ready to dig.
- 2. Ask your neighbours if they have some plants that need dividing. They might be delighted to share some with us.
- 3. If you hear of anyone who has a lot of plants to donate, contact Barb Morrison and she will organize a potting party on the property. 705-745-8738
- 4. As soon as the weather changes, be sure to pot up your plants early. They sell better if they look healthy and happy and that takes several days in the new pot. Use 6" pots if possible.
- 5. If you have plants to donate but just don't have the time to pot them up. Cathy Sheehey has a potting station in her yard. Give her a glass of wine and she has a wonderful time! :) Get them to her early! 799-0812
- 6. Remember: we need lots of volunteers for: the Friday before the sale, for potting parties, and on the day of the sale. Barb will have a sign up list available at our meetings. If you don't get a chance to sign, just come anyway. All help is appreciated!
- 7. If you need labels make a list of the plant names, colours, and how many of each you need and Kim Gunn will have the labels ready for you when you bring them in. 799-7475
- 8. If you need pots, we will have some at the meeting and you can pick up some from Carol Mitchell- 60 Mary St E. 799-6282
